




The Control Panel

- 3. Child lock key


- 4. Timer key

Before using your New Hob

- Read this guide, taking special note of the 'Safety Warnings' section.
- Remove any protective film that may still be on your ceramic hob.

Using the Touch Controls


- The controls respond to touch, so you don't need to apply any pressure.
- Use the ball of your finger, not its tip.
- You will hear a beep each time a touch is registered.
- Make sure the controls are always clean, dry, and that there is no object (e.g.
 a utensil or a cloth) covering them. Even a thin film of water may make the
 controls difficult to operate.




Using your Hob

To start cooking

- 1. Touch the ON/OFF () key, all the indicators show "- "
- Place a suitable pan on the cooking zone that you wish to use. Make sure the bottom of the pan and the surface of the cooking zone are clean and dry.
- Select the heating zone you wish to use. The indicator next to the key will flash "5". (This is the default power level when switching on a zone)



- Adjust the heat setting as required by touching the "Slider" control.
 - If you don't choose a heat setting within 1 minute, the Induction hob will automatically switch off. You will need to start again at step 1.
 - You can modify the heat setting at any time during cooking by selecting the heating zone, then touching the "Slider" control



When you have finished cooking

- 1. Select the heating zone that you wish to switch off
- 2. Turn the cooking zone off by scrolling down to "0" on the "Slider" control. Make sure the display shows "0".
- 3. Turn the whole cooktop off by touching the ON/OFF key.





Beware of hot surfaces

When "H" is displayed: the cooking zone is too hot to touch. It will disappear when the surface has cooled down to a safe temperature. It can also be used as an energy saving function if you want to heat further pans, use the hotplate that is still hot.

Locking the Controls (Child lock)

- You can lock the controls to prevent unintended use (for example children accidentally turning the cooking zones on).
- When the controls are locked, all the controls except the ON/OFF key are disabled.

To lock the controls

Touch the lock \bigcap key. The timer indicator will show "Lo" (Lock).

To unlock the controls

- 1. Make sure the hob is turned on.
- 2. Touch and hold the lock \bigcap key for 5 seconds.
- 3. You can now start using your hob.



When the hob is in lock mode, all the controls are disable except the ON/OFF key, you can always turn the hob off with the ON/OFF key in an emergency, but you will need to unlock the hob first before further operation.

Residual Heat Warning

When the hob has been operating for some time, there will be some residual heat. The letter "H" appears to warn you to keep away from the particular zone.



Auto Shutdown

Safety feature of the hob is auto shut down. This occurs whenever you forget to switch off a cooking zone. The default shutdown times are shown in the table below:

Power level	1	2	3	4	5	6	7	8	9
Default working timer (hour)	8	8	8	4	4	4	2	2	2

Using the Timer

You can use the timer in two different ways:

- You can use it as a minute minder. In this case, the timer will not turn any cooking zone off when the set time has expired.
- You can use it as cut-off timer to turn one or more cooking zones off after the set time has expired.

^{*}You can set the timer up to 99 minutes.
